### School resumes January 5th!

#### Reminders:

- Please renew 2<sup>nd</sup> semester bus passes and Kindergarten snack milk by Friday, January 6<sup>th</sup>. The semester bus fee is \$50. Please note there are no waivers available for Kindergarten snack milk. Any questions please direct them to 815-664-4601. Also note, that both of these fees must be paid in full.
- Please remember to call the offices by 9:00 a.m. if your child will not be attending school.
- During the cold and flu season, students must be fever free for a full 24 hours—without fever reducing medicine, before returning to school. Not only does this prevent the spread of germs, but protects your child from getting new ones or a relapse due to a compromised physical system.
- Remember your child will be outside before school and during recess, most days. Dressing in layers is suggested. Also, snow pants and boots are required to play on the equipment. We have many students who are forgetting winter coats, hats and gloves. Please make sure they have all the necessary gear when leaving for school.
