ISATs are coming!!!!

Yes, it is that time again.... The Illinois Standards Assessment Test, better known as ISATs, will take place on March 3rd through March 14th. These assessments are known as high-stakes testing because they were created to show a child's knowledge and achievement through one single assessment. While our students do very well on the assessment, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) has determined that they are going to continue to change cut scores on an assessment that has been normed by a completely different standard. ISBE has shown that all students' scores will be considerably lower than previous years. Please be aware that this is due to the norming and not your child's effort. In addition, all questions on the assessment in math and English Language Arts will be based on the new Illinois Learning Standards. This will be the first test using 100% of the new standards.

On another note, two classes of students in grades 3, 4, 6 and 8 will also be taking the PARCC Field Test. This is the pilot for the new assessment next year. ISBE has chosen the students by classes that will be taking the PARCC. Grades 3, 6, and 8 will be taking the assessment beginning March 24th, and grades 4 and 8 will be taking the assessment beginning May 5th.

We see nothing but great effort by our students and do not want to see students feel overwhelmed or disappointed for something they have no control over. However with this in mind, we still want to encourage all our students to do their very best on these assessments. Parents can assist their child by making sure they have a good nights sleep and a good breakfast during the two week testing windows. If you have any concerns please ask your child's teacher or give Mrs. B a call.
