PARCC is coming!!!!

Yes, it is that time again.... The New Illinois Learning Standards' Assessment Test, now known as PARCC, will take place on March 16th through April 10th. These assessments are rigorous, and reflect the new standards and 21st Century learning. They were created to show a child's knowledge, higher order thinking skills and achievement through these assessments. This session is called PBA-Performance Based Assessment. In May, students will take a second session called the EOY-End of Year. All students are required to be assessed in grades 3-8 this year. Next year it is projected to add K-2nd grade. Last year we participated in a pilot PARCC with only two sections of each grade level taking the sample assessment. For JFK, all sections of the test will be online.

We see nothing but great effort by our students and do not want to see students feel overwhelmed or disappointed as they approach this assessment due to the rigor and format. However with this in mind, we still want to encourage all our students to do their very best on these assessments. Parents can assist their child by making sure they have a good nights sleep and a good breakfast during the testing windows. If you have any concerns please ask your child's teacher or give Mrs. B a call.
